The Campus

Completed in 1994, the 204-acre campus of CSI/CUNY is the largest site for a college in New York City. The campus, centrally located on Staten Island, comprises 14 renovated neo-Georgian buildings and five new special purpose buildings set in a park-like landscape.

The academic buildings house 300 classrooms, laboratories and instructional spaces, study lounges, department and program offices, and faculty offices. Our attractive learning environment includes state-of-the-art facilities: the Astrophysical Observatory; the Biological Sciences/Chemical Sciences building for teaching and research; the Campus Center, the hub of student activities; the Center for the Arts, housing undergraduate and graduate programs in the arts as well as superb public spaces; the Library, enhanced by computer data-based operations and Media Services, a concentration of pedagogical multimedia materials made accessible throughout the campus via a fiber-optic network; and the outstanding Sports and Recreation Center and athletic fields that are also open to the public through membership.

The College and Its Community

It is estimated that one-third of Staten Island households have a connection to CSI as students, alumni, current employees, or retirees. The establishment of the College of Staten Island - Staten Island Project (CSI-SIP) acknowledged the importance of these ties. CSI-SIP is designed to integrate the work of the College with the public policy concerns of the people of Staten Island. CSI's Continuing Education programs had over 5,000 registrations from community residents in FY03.

Economic Impact

A 2004 economic impact study determined that the College, its employees, and its students expended nearly \$29 million, annually, at local businesses. It was estimated that these expenditures generated over \$57 million in business volume, and more than 4,200 local jobs including College employees.

CSI faculty were awarded over \$8.2 million in grants from public and private sources during FY03. CSI students were awarded over \$200,000 in scholarships from gifts and endowments.

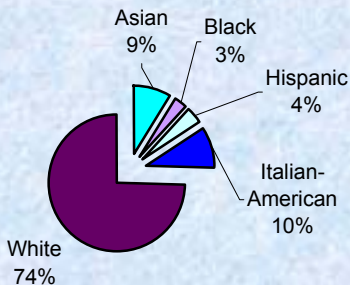

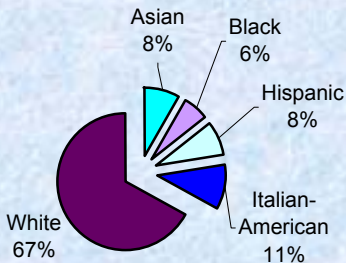
